


O1. Verb Tenses Flipbook

Carefully observe the given picture and describe it in your own words by writing a short paragraph.




- Write a paragraph of 60-70 words based on the picture.

Find and cut out the following from the newspaper:


- 10 Proper Nouns (names of people, places, brands, etc.)




Title: "Zooming Through Time with Grandpa!"

Create a comparison table: Postal Letters vs. Social Media (speed, cost, feelings, fun!). Include five points for each column.


5. Make a Mini Vlog!
